Appropriate Pay Rate for the Holidays - General Reminder

The Holidays are upon us and we wanted to remind everyone of the pay schedules for each of the Holidays below.

Thanksgiving

Thanksgiving is listed as one of the observed Holidays in both the Local Agreements between MCA, Local 98 and Local 636 and the NMA Agreement. Any Employee working this day under any of these Agreements is to be paid at the Double Time rate.

Friday following Thanksgiving

Local Agreements between MCA and Local 98 or Local 636 – Any Employee working under the Local Agreement is paid at the Straight Time Rate as the Local Agreements do **not** recognize this day as a Holiday.

NMA – The NMA allows for a floating Holiday. The Greater Detroit Building Trades have chosen to observe the floating Holiday on the Friday following Thanksgiving (see attached notice). Due to this the Friday after Thanksgiving is a holiday for Employees working **under the NMA** and any Employee performing work under the NMA is to be paid at the Double Time rate.

Christmas Day and New Year's Day

Both Christmas Day and New Year's Day fall on a Sunday this year. In both the Local Agreements between MCA, Local 98 and Local 636 and the NMA Agreement, the Monday following these holidays are observed as the Holiday. If an Employee works on either of these Mondays they are to be paid at the Double Time rate. If they work on the actual Holiday, they would be paid at the appropriate rate they would be eligible for any other Sunday of the year.

At its meeting on January 16, 1990, the National Maintenance Agreements Policy Committee, Inc. reviewed your letter of December 14, 1989, wherein the Greater Detroit Building and Construction Trades Council requested that the Committee grant authorization for the celebration of Washington's Birthday(Federal) on the Friday after Thanksgiving Day during 1990.

Pursuant to Article XI of the National Maintenance Agreements and Bulletin No. XI-2, you are hereby granted authorization to celebrate the floating holiday in lieu of Washington's Birthday(Federal) on the Friday after Thanksgiving Day during 1990, on all projects covered by the National Maintenance Agreements and that are within the geographical jurisdiction of the Greater Detroit Building and Construction Trades Council.

Please be advised that the application of this floating holiday to the Friday after Thanksgiving Day will remain in effect for future calendar years unless this office is otherwise notified in a timely fashion by your Building Trades Council. Be further advised that as a result of this action, Washington's Birthday(Federal) will be considered as a regular work day for projects covered under the National Maintenance Agreements within your geographical jurisdiction.

It is recommended in order to avoid any confusion, that contractors bidding or performing work in your Council's jurisdiction be provided with a copy of this communication for their information.

This is to notify you that at our Executive Board Meeting held December 5, 1989 a discussion came up regarding the National Maintenance Agreement under Article 11, Holidays, in particular, Washington's Birthday which is a Federal Holiday and should possibly be considered as a floating holiday to be celebrated on an alternate day.

If the affected parties to this agreement, within a specific geographic jurisdiction, do agree to celebrate the holiday on an alternate work day, authorization must be obtained in writing from the NMAPC Administration office.

After discussion was held, motion was made, supported and carried that I notify you; therefor, please be advised that the Executive Board of the Greater Detroit Building Trades Council voted that Washington's Birthday, which is considered a floating holiday under the National Maintenance Agreement, should be taken on the Friday after Thanksgiving.
